Apply for Medical Assistance if not covered by parental insurance planParticipate in transition education classesApply for residential programs/services when student is ready to move to a new living situation. There are often waiting lists for these programs, so it is important to apply as early as possibleActively participate in transition IEP meetings
Continue to participate in the employment planning process, including supported work environments with your Vocational Rehabilitation Services Counselor
Continue to assess ongoing needs and supports for independent living Continue to learn about the rights and responsibilities in developing self-advocacy skills
Continue to assess transportation needs and training Continue to establish social/recreational activities Continue to solidify plans for post-secondary training (See 17/18
